

KARUAH EAST QUARRY PROJECT HISTORY

The original Commonwealth EPBC Approval (2014/7282) for the Karuah East Quarry (KEQ) was granted on 20 March 2015, following DCCEEW's assessment of the Karuah East Quarry EPBC Act Assessment Report (ELA, October 2014). This approval included a condition (Condition 7) requiring the proponent to comply with the offset conditions in the NSW Project Approval (MP09_0175) and conditions (Condition 8 and 9) for the provision of a Biodiversity Offset Area (BOA) across part Lot 13 DP 1024564, Lot 14 DP 1024564 and Lot 5 DP 838128, and Biodiversity Area Offset Management Plan (BOAMP).

The intent of this BOA was to provide conservation of protected matters that was to be impacted by the KEQ Project. In their EPBC Act Assessment Report, EcoLogical Australia (ELA 2014) identified impacts to the following protected matters:

- Koala (Phascolarctos cinereus).
- Tetratheca juncea (Black-eyed Susan).
- Asperula asthenes (Trailing Woodruff).
- *Grevillea parviflora* subsp. *parviflora* (Small-Flowered Grevillea) (note: no Small-Flowered Grevillea were identified within the original KEQ footprint indirect impact only).

As per Condition 9 of the EPBC Approval the preparation and implementation of a BOAMP was required. As part of this Baseline Ecological Surveys and Monitoring (KLF, 2016) was conducted in 2015. These surveys resulted in an increase in the number of threatened flora species within the BOA (**Table 1**).

On 27 April 2018, the NSW Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure (NSW Planning) (formerly DPE) approved the KEQ MOD1 Project, which consisted of a nominal increase in disturbance of approximately 2,500 m². The modification was to allow for improved safety of quarry operations in the proximity of the quarry crushing plant. The MOD 1 Project necessitated Variation 1 to the Commonwealth EPBC Approval as a result of minor increased impacts to protected matters. Kleinfelder (2017) completed revised offset calculations to support the EPBC 2014/7282 Variation 1 Application showing that offsetting rations set out in the EPBC Act Assessment Report (ELA, 2014) were maintained. The variation was subsequently approved on 04 October 2018.



KARUAH EAST QUARRY MOD 10 & REPLACEMENT OFFSET AREA

The KEQ MOD 10 Project will occur within a portion of the BOA with impacts to previously conserved Commonwealth protected matters, as summarised by **Table 2** and illustrated by **Figures 1** to **4**, respectively. These biodiversity values form the basis of the component of the total offsets package assessed that is considered by this Variation Application. Karuah East Quarry will provide like-for-like replacement offsets for those EPBC Act matters that were conserved within the impacted portion of the BOA.

The summary provided in **Table 2** outlines an assessment of impacts within the BOA using the data and information detailed in the EPBC Act Assessment Report (ELA, 2014). As per the Biodiversity Development Assessment Report (BDAR) (KLF, 2023) prepared for the MOD 10 project, the replacement offset area is proposed within part Lot 201 DP 1042537 and part Lot 21 DP 1024341. The distribution of relevant protected matters identified within Lot 201 & Lot 21 is show in **Figure 5** and summarised in **Table 2**. This demonstrates the proposed replacement BOA contains sufficient biodiversity values to maintain the impact to offsetting ratio of the EPBC Approval (as per **Table 1**).

SECURITY MECHANISM FOR REPLACEMENT BOA

The replacement BOA will be provided by utilising the mechanisms available under the BOS and secured accordingly through the establishment of a Biodiversity Stewardship Agreement (BSA). Through this process, the exact boundaries of the BOA will be determined in consultation with, and subject to approval by, the Nature Markets and Offsets Division within the NSW Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water (NSW DCCEEW).

Security for completion of this process is provided through the inclusion of Condition 7 of the Commonwealth EPBC Approval requiring the proponent to comply with the offset conditions of the NSW Project Approval which includes two requirements for secondary approvals to be gained prior to the commencement of any vegetation clearing activities for the KEQ MOD 10 Project, including:

• Schedule 3, Condition 28 – Biodiversity Offset Strategy.

Requiring approval of the offset strategy (total offset package) by NSW Planning.





• Schedule 3, Condition 29 – Long-Term Security of Offsets.

Requiring approval of the final position of the Replacement BOA by NSW DCCEEW.

CONCLUSION


